Event Details:

- Students must arrive and enter Ambrose Estate at 6.00pm for a 6.30pm start
Upon arrival, students must register and present their ticket
- Pre-dinner drinks will be served in the foyer and the balcony before moving into the Function Centre where they will be served substantial small dishes, canapes, and large grazing tables.

(Students are not permitted to leave before this time)
Students must be collected by parents/guardians from the Function Room entrance.

Dress Code:

Semi-formal occasions such as the Dinner Dance require dressing in a special way to help generate a sense of occasion. We ask all Year 11 students to have a mature understanding of the dress code appropriate for this school function.

Students should consider their choice of attire and we ask they demonstrate a reasonable standard of modesty as befitting this event. Any students deemed by Newman College staff to be inappropriately dressed will be refused admission and their parents/guardians will be contacted for collection.

Male students are asked to wear trousers and a button-up shirt (tie and jacket are optional) with dress shoes. Sneakers are not permitted.

Female students are encouraged to wear attire suitable to be worn to dinner at a restaurant or a significant family function/ceremony. Please refrain from wearing outfits that have plunging necklines, bare midriffs, or low-cutbacks (below the waist), or very short dresses or skirts (as a guide – hemlines should be no shorter than the tips of the fingers when arms are extended by your side).

All students should be mindful of their choice of shoes, as neither female nor males will be allowed to remove their shoes at the venue.

Students are encouraged to speak with their Leader of Wellbeing, or the Deputy Principal Secondary should they have any questions about the dress code or wish to seek advice on their attire before the function.
